As a part of ensuring quality, IQAC collected and analyzed feedback from different stakeholders and findings were discussed for taking actions, if necessary. Teachers constitute an important stakeholder group in higher educational institutions. During the academic year 2023- 24, feedback was collected from teachers through Feedback Form. The Form contained 15 statements, in Five Point Likert Scale. Faculty members have to write numbers 5 to zero against each statement as their response. (5= Strongly Agree, 4= Agree, 3= Neither Agree or 2= Disagree and 1= Disagree). Duly filled in forms were received from 36 teachers.

### Analysis & Observations:

### 1. Teaching and Course Design:

- A majority of respondents agree that the courses and syllabi have a good balance between theory and practical application (94.44% combined "Strongly Agree" and "Agree").
- Course objectives are perceived as well-defined by 88.88% of respondents.
- Most respondents (86.11%) feel that the reference materials such as books and journals are relevant and updated.

### 2. Interest and Knowledge Growth:

 Over 91% of respondents agree that the courses increased their interest, knowledge, and perspective in the subject area. 3. Teaching Freedom:

 100% of respondents indicated they have the freedom to adopt new teaching techniques and testing strategies, with 72.22% "Strongly Agreeing" to this point.

4. Assessment and Examination:

 91.67% of the faculty believe that tests and examinations are conducted on time with adequate coverage of the syllabus.

5. Library and Facilities:

- While most faculty members agree that **books are available in the library** (75% combined), a significant number feel there is some limitation in availability (5.56% strongly disagree).
- The ICT facilities (91.66% approval) and the canteen space for teachers (100%) are seen as satisfactory by most respondents.

6. Administrative Support:

 Faculty finds the administration teacher-friendly with 100% agreement, and the college provides adequate support for skill and qualification upgrading (100% positive responses).

7. Environment and Maintenance:


Both the college environment (94.44%) and facilities such as classrooms (100%) and toilets/washrooms (100%) are rated highly for cleanliness and maintenance.

### Conclusion:

The feedback received from faculty members shows a highly positive response toward the overall teaching environment, administrative support, and infrastructure. While there are some areas like library resources that need improvement, the general perception of the college's teaching environment, infrastructure, and administration is overwhelmingly favorable.

The table given above shows the summary of the analysis of feedback collected from alumni on various matters related to curriculum, facilities in the college, services rendered and other aspects which are directly related to the satisfaction of students as a part of stakeholders of the college. As a part of collection of feedback, a questionnaire with 10 questions in four-point rating scale, was sent to them. The answer to each question has four options viz Excellent =4; Very Good = 3; Good = 2 and Poor =1. Responses received from the alumni of last five years for each of the 10 questions in the questionnaire are given in the following paragraphs.

### **Overall Grade Point:**

Based on the responses and ratings across the parameters, the overall grade point for the college is:

3.33 (on a 4-point Likert scale).

### **Key Observations:**

Faculty and Library & Educational Resources received the highest "Excellent" responses (52.80% and 56.90%, respectively), indicating strong satisfaction in these areas.

Campus Atmosphere stood out with 66.50% rating it as "Excellent," the highest score among all parameters.

Courses' Relevance to job/occupation received a moderate rating, with 45.70% considering them "Excellent" and 33.00% "Very Good."

Alumni Engagement (Parameters 8 & 9) showed scope for improvement, with "Excellent" responses below 45%.

Infrastructure, Lab, and Canteen Facilities had a slightly higher "Poor" rating at 4.60%, pointing to potential improvement areas.

### Conclusion and Recommendations:

The alumni feedback highlights overall positive satisfaction with faculty, campus atmosphere, and library resources. To enhance the alumni experience further, the institution may consider:

- Improving alumni representation in college activities.
- Revisiting course content for better alignment with job/occupation requirements.

The 3.33 overall grade point reflects a solid performance, with opportunities for improvement in alumni engagement and infrastructure.
